Sample Litigation

Illegal Eviction Defense & Subsequent Litigation. 2017 – 2018, Rock County

Obtained dismissal in court of an illegal (and retaliatory) eviction filed against a disabled man who required a service dog. This disabled client contacted the law clinic, more than hour away, after finding there is no capacity (no lawyers) in a rural corner of Rock county that could provide affordable eviction defense services. Subsequent to successful eviction defense (and unsuccessful negotiations), the NLC filed an action against the landlord for stealing from the disabled renter and obtained a judgment in excess of \$10,000.
