CPP's engagement program helps investigators engage stakeholders in the design, implementation and evaluation of proposed research and to disseminate findings and applied tools in accessible, and usable forms for consumers, providers, and policymakers. My expertise is grounded in the lived experience of patients navigating the U.S. healthcare system from teaching in our patient advocacy clinical. It is equally influenced by my keen understanding of the challenges facing providers and healthcare leaders today. As a founding member of the Primary care Academics Transforming Healthcare (PATH) Collaborative, I partner with UWHealth primary care physician leaders, researchers, and quality improvement leaders on primary care redesign innovations and dissemination of results. From 2014-2015, I was a Faculty Fellow in the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's Future of Public Health Law Program in which I developed an innovative online course on the role of law and lawyers to advance health.

Precommitment, Patient Choice of Physician, and Reducing the Use of Low-Value Health Care
