PROPOSAL FOR DIRECTED RESEARCH (LAW 990) OR DIRECTED READING (LAW 991)

Law School Rule 3.13

Directed reading and directed research are governed primarily by <u>Law School Rule 3.13</u>. **Directed reading** is similar to a lecture course, and **directed research** similar to a seminar, but without necessarily the same number of scheduled meetings as a course/seminar. Directed research will result in the production of a research paper; a student's directed reading will be tested by some form of written work.

CREDITS: The credit standard for all directed study is met by an expectation of at least 45 hours of student engagement with the associated learning activities for each credit awarded, to include the student's time spent meeting with supervising faculty as well as the student's time spent reading, researching, doing assignments, writing, etc. (e.g. 2 credits should involve at least 90 hours of associated learning activities; 3 credits, 135 hours, etc.)

Note: No more than eight (8) credits of directed reading and six (6) credits of directed research can be applied to the 90 credits required for the J.D. degree. (Additionally, a single directed reading is limited to 1 to 3 credits.) Regular letter grades are not authorized for directed research or directed reading; grading will be simply "satisfactory/unsatisfactory."
